

# **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The period between 2019 and 2022 marked a challenging phase for NVSU, significantly impeded by the COVID-19 outbreak. This led to a shift towards online learning and a modular approach due to lockdown restrictions that caused a disruption in the delivery of university services. Consequently, the university witnessed constrained linkages and collaborations, further exacerbated by the limitation on physical movement and the absence of in-person activities. These challenges also extended to various operational facets of the university, causing delayed service delivery to our clientele. Financially, the university was under pressure as 35% of MOOE was redirected to the National Treasury to support the fight against COVID-19.

The new leadership has taken a proactive and strategic stance to steer the university ahead. The developed and implemented Strategic Plan 2023-2032 aimed to chart a new course for the university. Through strategic planning and a proactive approach, there is renewed hope for a brighter future for NVSU, demonstrating a steadfast commitment to navigating through the adversities posed by the pandemic and achieving long-term goals.

Along with the Strategic Plan 2023-2032, the university crafted the Five Developmental Goals aligned with the four functions of the university:

- 1) Transitioning to Globally Competitive Graduates
- 2) Internationalization
- 3) Research and Development cum Community Engagement
- 4) Technology Commercialization (Innovation)
- 5) Administrative Efficiency

The university has demonstrated its unwavering commitment to academic excellence, which is a source of pride for our entire community. For 2023, the university reached a significant milestone, with 33 out of 44 programs that obtained higher levels of accreditation. AACCUP recognized the university for having the second-highest number of Level III Accredited Programs, Furthermore, the BS Computer Science program received Level IV accreditation. In terms of student performance, those who took board examinations in October 2023 achieved impressive rankings. One NVSU graduate secured a position in the Foresters' Licensure Examination, a top five position in the Geodetic Engineers' Licensure Examination, and a top 4 position in the Electronics Technicians' Licensure Examination. The examinees of the Nutritionist- Dietitian Licensure Examination achieved an outstanding 100% passing rate, surpassing the national passing rate of 73.48%. Students also excelled in national and international beauty, culture, sports, and performing arts competitions. Additionally, faculty members were nationally and regionally recognized for their outstanding expertise in their fields. The first international NVSU Alumni Association Thailand Chapter was established. NVSU graduates are now teaching in different schools across Thailand.

The Office of International Affairs has established partnerships with organizations and institutions in various countries, including Belgium, Japan, Vietnam, Indonesia, Thailand, Brazil, and the USA. These collaborations exemplify the university's steadfast dedication to fostering international cooperation and global engagement. Alumni benefit from unique opportunities to partake in professional initiatives in Japan through OISCA. Our faculty members have actively engaged in benchmarking activities in Belgium, delivered paper presentations in international fora, participated as visiting fellows in the USA, and participated in comprehensive training courses and specialized programs in various Southeast Asian nations facilitated by SEARCA. Due to the university's diligent efforts, NVSU has been officially acknowledged by the World University Rankings for Innovation (WURI) as among the top 101-200 Most Innovative Universities worldwide. This recognition reflects the university's strong foothold in fostering innovation and academic excellence. In addition, the university was formally accepted in the University Mobility in Asia and the Pacific (UMAP).

For 2023, an impressive 37.5% of research findings have been published in internationally recognized journals. This reflects a strong and sustained culture of generating and disseminating output. From 17 linkages and collaborations in 2022, 78 partnerships with LGUS, industries, NGOs, NGAs, SMEs, and other stakeholders were established because of extension activities. The university has recently entered into several significant agreements to support various programs and initiatives. These agreements included a Memorandum of Agreement with NVSU & DA-Philrice to fund the National Cooperative Test for Cool Elevated Area (NCT-CE) with a budget of Php191,400.00. Additionally, the university has secured funding from DA-ACEF to upgrade the Citrus Disease Diagnostic and Indexing Facility and the Food Processing Center, with Php10,000.00 and Php2,431.200.00, respectively. Furthermore, the Nueva Vizcaya Chamber of Commerce Incorporated has pledged Php 100,000.00 for the Value Chain Analysis of Coffee in Nueva Vizcaya. In support of various programs, CHED has also approved a budget of Php 20,000,000.00 for the NVSU Community Sports and Wellness Program: SALUN-AT and Study Ph, amounting to Php 23,790,531.00.

Four new research and development centers were established after the BOR Approval to enrich academic programs. The NVSU Animal Health and Diagnostic Center (NAHDC) advances animal health through diagnostics, research, comprehensive veterinary services, disease management, and farmers' training and education of future veterinarians. The NVSU Mathematical Modeling and Statistics Center (MMSC), envisions to be a regional hub for advanced mathematical research and statistical analysis. The Banana Resources Research and Training Center (BRRTC), under the College of Agriculture, consolidates all research and development on banana planting materials support systems, pest and disease management, and improved production systems. The Plant-Pest Clinic and Diagnostic Center (PPCDC) provides accurate detection and characterization of pests and diseases and proper control.

In the fiscal year 2023, the university achieved significant progress in its finances, with a remarkable 106.04% increase in Revenue Collection Efficiency compared to the previous year. This indicates an effective administrative measure and reflects strong financial management, instilling confidence in the university's future stability among stakeholders. Also, eight new vehicles were purchased to provide comfortable transportation for faculty, staff, and students, facilitating the delivery of university services. Furthermore, the university has implemented a three-stage merit promotion system for teaching and non-teaching personnel to enhance professional development. As a result, 18 teaching staff members were promoted based on merit, 72 positions were reclassified, and 87 new positions were created for the ROSSS Phase 1. On top of it all, the Board of Regents has approved the reclassification of teaching staff, leading to the promotion of 281 faculty members under NBC 461-8th cycle and 168 faculty members under CHED-DBM JC.No3.

The university has recently put forward competitive bids for the prestigious Philippine Quality Awards (PQA) in partnership with the Department of Trade and Industry. In parallel, the university's official website has undergone an extensive rebranding process, resulting in a remarkable surge in its online followership. Furthermore, the university has made significant strides by introducing three cutting-edge online digital platforms: the Online Procurement and Payment System, designed to streamline and enhance the efficiency of procurement processes; the Human Resource Management Information System, aimed at modernizing and centralizing human resource management operations; and the Document Casing System, a sophisticated tool to facilitate efficient documentation management. The Board approved the 2023-2032 NVSU Land Use Development and Infrastructure Plan (LUDIP) designed to fortify and enhance the university's infrastructure over the next decade, ensuring that it is well-equipped to support the needs of the institution and its community. The university has completed projects totaling Php 48,353,112.35, covering infrastructure development, construction, and renovation. Ongoing projects across both campuses amount to Php 42,214, 439.69. The university embarked on a significant IT infrastructure upgrade by implementing the Fiber Optic and Campus Wide Wi-Fi Project, with an expenditure of Php 7,265,000. Additionally, it allocated Php 11,200,000.00 for the procurement of ICT resources and to ensure classroom readiness for both Flexible Learning and Face-to-Face classes. Moreover, the university acquired 843 volumes of books at a total cost of Php 5,779,863.95.

Over the upcoming years, the university is committed to enhancing and advancing the Five Development Goals. The goal is to encourage greater involvement of students and faculty in international initiatives. Additionally, the university aims to provide more opportunities and experiences for the students, as well as for the teaching and non-teaching staff. Researchers will strive to be increasingly pioneering in the development of various technologies. Finally, administrative effectiveness will be continually improved to ensure its relevance as the NVSU grapples with diverse challenges.


# **ENROLLMENT AND GRADUATION TRENDS**

# LICENSURE EXAMINATION PERFORMANCE




# LICENSURE **EXAMINATION PASSERS**

Courses with notable passers include Secondary Education (422 passers), Elementary Education (80 passers), and Forestry (47 passers). There are a total of 715 passers across different programs.


# **SCHOLARSHIPS**





A total of 10 faculty members were mobilized to four countries to improve teaching and research capabilities, foster innovation, and facilitate exchange of knowledge and ideas among educators.




### **FACULTY EVALUATION**

### FACULTY PERFORMANCE EVALUATION SYSTEM (FPES)

The NVSU-FPES is a secured client-server web-based application developed to facilitate fast, accurate. and reliable Faculty Performance Evaluation by the students via the University's iNVSU intranet. This is an online system that automates the computation of faculty evaluation results and generates timely and accurate reports. It is owned by the Nueva Vizcaya State University under the supervision of the Educational Testing Center Office, and managed and maintained by the Computer Science and Information Technology (CSIT) Departments.



# TREND IN FACULTY PERFORMANCE BY STUDENT RATING




An increasing turnout of Faculty Performance Evaluation System (FPES) online forms from 78% to 83.5% was observed for the last two (2) semesters, the Second Semester of AY 2022 - 2023 and the First Semester of AY2023 - 2024. Consequently, in the recently concluded FPES, students rated their instructors and professors from Bambang and Bayombong 4.52 (Outstanding) and 4.44 (Very Satisfactory), respectively.


### CHED-DBM JC3 RECLASSIFICATION






# **UNIVERSITY IN-HOUSE REVIEW**

RET ensures that research outputs of the university are made available to the community through scientific publishing in credible international and national journals.






# **AWARDS AND RECOGNITIONS**

# RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT CENTERS

In addition to established R&D Centers in the university, four (4) new Centers were established in 2023, reflecting NVSU's thirst for innovation.

The NVSU Animal Health and Diagnostic Center (NAHDC), established through BOR Resolution No. 09-06-089, under the College of Veterinary Medicine is dedicated to advancing animal health through diagnostics, research and comprehensive veterinary services supporting both small animals and livestock. The NAHDC serves as a resource for disease management, farmer training and education of future veterinarians;

The NVSU Mathematical Modeling and Statistics Center (MMSC), established through BOR Resolution No. 09-06-090, aims to establish a regional hub for advanced mathematical research and statistical analysis, enhancing the university's capabilities in addressing significant socio-economic challenges through interdisciplinary quantitative research and capacity-building initiatives;


The Banana Resources Research and Training Center (BRRTC), established through BOR No. Resolution No. 09-06-091, consolidates all R&D undertakings of the university on banana planting materials support system, pest and disease management. improved production systems, and product development; and

The Plant-Pest Clinic and Diagnostic Center (PPCDC), established through BOR No. Resolution No. 09-06-092 provides accurate detection and characterization of pest and diseases of high value crops, and proper recommendation for appropriate control and improvement of crop yield.




# **ACTIVE LINKAGES**

The university prioritizes collaboration to strengthen its RET PAPs. This year, the university forged 28 new memorandum of agreement (MOA) with multisectoral partners, increased the number of active linkages from 50 in 2022 to 78 in 2023, far exceeded the initial target of 20. The Planning, Development, and Information Systems (PDIS) is the lead office in the operations and implementation of the holistic blueprint of the NVSU's physical planning and development.



# PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT OFFICE (PDO)

The PDO spearheads planning, consolidation, assessment, and evaluation with the different units, offices, departments, divisions, and colleges of the university to develop cohesive development plan.

# PHYSICAL PLANT AND SITE DEVELOPMENT (PPSD)

The PPSD manages the university's infrastructure, transportation for officials and stakeholders, and services like carpentry, electrical, air-conditioning, maintenance, and water and sewerage systems.

# MANAGEMENT AND INFORMATION SYSTEMS (MIS)

The MIS ensures and maintains technological breakthroughs, internet connectivity, and a functional information system for the university.

### INFORMATION PROMOTION, AND PUBLIC RELATIONS CENTER (IPPRC)

The IPPRC serves as the information arm of the university and maintains good relations with other institutions and agencies.



# PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT

The Planning and Development Office (PDO) shall be the "Think tank" of the university, thus, it shall have a comprehensive grasp of the direction and the roadmap of the university in a given period of time.

### LAND USE DEVELOPMENT AND INFRASTRUCTURE PLAN 2023-2032

The Planning and Development Office (PDO) assisted in the creation of the CHED Region 02-reviewed Land Use Development and Infrastructure Plan (LUDIP) in 2022 and was approved by the Board of Regents on May, 2023.

### **BEYOND BORDERS**

The PDO along with the Quality Assurance Office facilitated the application of the university in the WURI 2023 securing a rank within 101-200.

#### PREFFERED FUTURE

The PDO took the lead in crafting the University Strategic Plan 2023-2032 by conducting series of workshops which included the following: Baseline Setting, Environmental Scanning, Consultation with Experts, Presentation with the Stakeholders, Approval Process and Cascading of the Strategic Plan.

During the consultation with experts, the university tapped the expertise of the Center for Local and Regional Governance (CLRG) from the National Center for Public Administration and Governance (NCPAG), UP Diliman, Quezon City. The said plan was presented to the Board of Regents and was approved through Board Resolution No. 09-06-081 on September 6, 2023.

The cascading of the plan was conducted later part of the year along with the initial meetings on the conduct of Operational Planning (OPLAN) for all colleges and units. The OPLAN shall capture programs, activities, and projects aligned with the university strategic plan.

#### **SMART AND GREEN CAMPUS**

The PDO, PPSD, and CERMSD through the leadership of then retired Vice President for Planning Development and Information Systems, Prof. Elmer T. Castañeto, worked hand in hand in crafting the Land Use Development and Infrastructure Plan (LUDIP) of the university. Said Plan was then modified through the leadership of Dr. Jayson Caranza and it was presented before the CHED-02 review committee and further approved by the Board of Regents through Board Resolution No 05-11-23 s. 2023 on May 2023.

The LUDIP as the campus master plan is very crucial in the infrastructure planning of the university. It contains the allocation and utilization of the land within a campus' geographic boundary to meet the required academic and non-academic support services and facilities. It also ensures compliance of RA 11396 an act requiring state universities and Colleges (SUCs) to prepare and implement a Land Use Development and Infrastructure Plan that shall include the construction of dormitories for students and housing sites for employees.



### INTERVENTIONS AND INITIATIVES

The Planning Officer proposed for the institutionalization of the Full-Time Delivery Unit (FDU). This would facilitate and monitor the financial and physical performance of the university which are crucial in the preparation of Budget Proposal, Agency Performance and even in the qualification for Performance-Based Bonus (PBB). At present, the university has active members of FDU and the PDO serving as the general secretary of the regular meetings.

### **FUTURES THINKING**

The PDO's proposal on capacity building under the Future's Thinking program of the office of Sen. Pia Cavetano was granted with one million funding. The fund was utilized in the conduct of Re-LOGIN (Reinforcing Local Governance with Innovations through Higher Education Institutions) Training held in DBP Complex, Baquio City on November 6-9, 2023.

The concept of TOWN and GOWN was introduced to the university to further strengthen the collaboration and partnership of NVSU with local government units in the province. The TOWN representing the 15 towns of Nueva Vizcaya and the GOWN symbolizing the academic regalia enunciating expertise of NVSU in various fields. were in fusion with research and extension endeavors.

### PROMOTION OF LOCAL HERITAGE

The PDO, as one of the proponents of the Study Ph project with almost 24M grant from CHED had started to collaborate with the elders of Indigenous Groups of the Province such as the Gaddang, Isinai, and Bugkalot. This project aimed to showcase the rich cultural heritage of Nueva Vizcaya, it would highlight the local cuisines, dances, songs and would fortify the Nueva Vizcava Studies.

Likewise, the PDO assisted in the re-arrangement and curation of the university museum dubbed as Museo Vizcaino, prior to the visit of officials from the University of Michigan who were turned over historical photographs of the Bugkalot group.

### **MERITORIOUS AWARD**

As proof of the unwavering commitment of the PDO to serve the university and its clientele, the office was recognized as BEST UNIT during the 19th Charter Anniversary.



# PHYSICAL PLANT AND SITE DEVELOPMENT

The PPSDS (Physical Plant and Site Development Services) plays a crucial role in ensuring the effective management, maintenance, and development of the physical infrastructure and facilities of the university. This unit oversees a wide range of functions related to the upkeep and improvement of campus buildings, grounds, utilities, and overall site development.

## MOTORPOOL SECTION









# INFORMATION, PROMOTION, AND PUBLIC RELATIONS CENTER



This streamlined approach enhanced service delivery, responsiveness, and transparency, thereby reinforcing the University's commitment to operational excellence and stakeholder satisfaction.








#### Recruitment, Selection, and Plan

**NEW APPOINTMENTS** 

NVSU's commitment to upholding the Program to Institutionalize Meritocracy and Excellence in Human Resource Management (PRIME-HRM) emphasized the enhancement of administrative efficiency, which included optimizing HR practices to attract, select, and retain highly qualified individuals for teaching and non-teaching roles. A total of 114 appointments were facilitated through reappointments. promotions, original hires, re-employments, transfers from other agencies, reclassifications, and the Revised Organization and Staffing Standards for SUCs (ROSSS) Phase 1.





#### **PANUNUMPA**

After rigorous process of complying with the requirements for reclassification, NVSU facilitated three separate Appointment Ceremonies on various dates. For the year 2023, a total of 281 new appointees were reclassified through the NBC 461 - 8th Cycle, 12 were promoted through Merit Promotion - Batch 1, and 5 newly hired personnel under the "Scrap and Build" initiative. This massive employment success speaks volume of the concerted works of the university to faculty development and recognition of their contributions toward achieving the goals of the university.



#### **PAGLAGDA**

The series of Mass Contract Signing events called 'Paglagda' was joined by 156 job orders and contract of service (JO/COS) workers from July to December 2023 period which demonstrated the acceleration and enchancement of service delivery.

#### DIGITALIZATION INITIATIVES



In line with our commitment to advancing digitalization, NVSU was selected as a host institution for the Fulbright Specialist Program, an initiative of the U.S. Department of State. This program offers U.S. academics and professionals the chance to engage in short-term, project-based exchanges globally. On November 11, 2023, the executive committee conducted interviews to finalize the Fulbright Specialist. Proposed projects included the development of a University Online Document Tracking System, an Online Procurement and Payment System (OPPS) and a Human Resource Management Information System.







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## STRATEGIC PROCUREMENT MANAGEMENT

Effective procurement management was guided by strategic frameworks and transparent practices, NVSU optimized procurement processes and ensured cost-effectiveness and sustainability. These efforts not only strengthened NVSU's financial resilience but also facilitated strategic investments in infrastructure and academic resources.

The table shows a significant increase of 69.98% on the above-mentioned procurable items. The uninterrupted activities of the restructured BAC into three committees prompted the university to score 2.52 out of 3 perfect scores in the last concluded Agency Procurement Compliance Performance Indicator (APCPI) result.



# FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT SERVICES

NVSU achieved a remarkable overall obligation rate of 97.76% from last year's 95.06% and disbursement rate of 92.63% from last year's 92.31%, reflecting its commitment to fiscal responsibility. The university notably improved its obligation rate for Capital Outlay (CO) from both current and continuing appropriations compared to the previous year.




2022 OVERALL OBLIGATION RATE

Auxiliary services marked a significant increase in revenue, totaling Php 7,818,039.79, noted a 22.83% rise from the previous fiscal year. Meanwhile, expenses decreased to Php 4,114,767.89, reflecting a 23.61% reduction compared to FY 2022. Catering and food services are the top- earning auxiliary serices, also offering venues for events and dormitories for students. These financial metrics demonstrated NVSU's effective management and strategic allocation of resources in its auxiliary operations, contributed to financial sustainability and enhanced service delivery across campus.






# **BUSINESS AFFAIRS**

## **INCOME PERFORMANCE**

The highest income, 46%, stemmed from commercial and rice seed production and marketing. The RET incidental income, AEOP Nursery, and Rice Production, fall under Research Extension and Training, while the Water Refilling Station operates under Auxiliary Services.





#### NVSU SABATAN TECHNOPRENEURS HUB

The NVSU Sabatan Technopreneurs Hub supported and enabled these technologies to achieve market and technology readiness once the patent would be approved by the Intellectual Patent Office (IPO). These technologies helped the business affairs in the income generation through technology commercialization and transfer. A key highlight was the collaborative meetings with different stakeholders which played a crucial role in advancing these technologies.
