Level II signifies proficiency in quality management, highlighting NVSU's systematic approach to delivering efficient, effective, and excellent services.

NVSU innovator among top 10 Pinoy delegates to LIF Global 2025

Dr. Sony P. Aquino, Professor V from the Department of Agricultural and Biosystems Engineering of Nueva Vizcaya State University's College of Engineering, is among the Top 10 Filipino innovators chosen to represent the Philippines in the prestigious Leaders in Innovation Fellowship (LIF) Global 2025.

Dr. Aguino completed an intensive two-week residential training program, which concluded on July 12, 2025. The fellowship, organized by the Royal Academy of Engineering (RAEng) in the United Kingdom, brings together 76 innovators from 14 countries with a shared mission: to equip researchers with entrepreneurial skills needed to transform their innovations into market-ready ventures.

Dr. Aguino is advancing his project the Biogas Digester, a clean energy innovation designed to address agricultural waste management—through focused training on intellectual property rights, business development, investment readiness, and market strategy.

His participation embodies NVSU's commitment to bringing research outputs

commitment to bringing research outputs beyond the laboratory and into real-world application, aligned with the university's thrust toward technology commercialization.

As Chief of NVSU's Intellectual

Nueva Vizcaya State University (NVSU) hosted Dr. Awais Khan, a Fulbright Specialist, Ássociate Professor, and Associate **Director for Extension and** Outreach at the School of Integrative Plant Science, Section of Plant Pathology and Plant-Microbe Biology, **Cornell University, New** York, USA.

Dr. Khan joined NVSU as the expert scientist for the project 'Molecular Profiling of NVSU Citrus Germplasm Collection" under the Fulbright Specialist Program, in collaboration with the Philippine-American Educational Foundation (PAEF) also known as Fulbright Commission in the Philippines.

This engagement stemmed from the sustained internationalization efforts of University President Dr. Wilfredo A. Dumale Jr. and the Office of International Affairs (OIA), led by Atty. Regine Karla G. In a renewed effort to advance international academic and research collaboration, scientists from Mie University, Japan, returned to Nueva Vizcaya State University (NVSU) for a follow-up visit last August 1.

This activity is part of the project titled International Expert Engagement for Academic and Research Advancement.

Following their initial engagement in December 2024, this second visit builds on the momentum of the ongoing partnership between NVSU and Mie University, particularly in citrus science, including breeding, cultivation, and value-added product development.

Spearheaded by the Office of the President led by University President Dr. Wilfredo A. Dumale Jr. and the Office of International Affairs, led by Atty. Regine Karla G. Tabas, in collaboration with the Citrus Research and Resources Development Center (CRRDC) led by Director Dr. Elbert A.

Sana, the engagement featured visits to NVSU's research facilities and field trips to the Philippine Citrus Resources Development Center and partner farms.

The itinerary also included farm tours in Kasibu town—specifically Dinamling Farm, Lunag Farm, and J&J Farm in Villaverde—and a visit to the Maloi Association Winery Processing facility, showcasing community-led citrus product innovations.

Focused discussions with NVSU researchers were also conducted to explore collaborative themes and local practices aligned with Japan's Sixth Industry concept, aimed at promoting academic enrichment and regional agri-technological development.



NVSU, DOST-PTRI ink MOA for strengthened research innovation partnership

Nueva Vizcaya State University (NVSU) and the Department of Science and Technology – Philippine Textile Research Institute (DOST-PTRI) formally sealed a partnership through a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) signing, solidifying their commitment to advance research, innovation, and development in the field of textiles and related technologies, held at the Board Room, NVSU Bayombong Campus, Sept. 1.

The collaboration aims to leverage the strengths of both institutions in promoting sustainable textile research, capacity-building, and technology transfer, particularly in line with the country's growing advocacy for science-driven solutions and ecofriendly innovations.

The partnership is also aligned with DOST-PTRI's SEDA Pilipinas program, a national initiative that seeks to revitalize and expand the country's sericulture industry.

Representing DOST-PTRI was Director Dr. Julius Leaño Jr., while University President Dr. Wilfredo A. Dumale Jr. and Dr. Jayson Q. Caranza, Dean of the College of Forestry, Environment, and Resource Management (CFERM), signed on behalf of NVSU. The event was witnessed by university officials, faculty members, and DOST representatives, with CFERM serving as the college directly engaged in implementing the partnership initiatives.

In his welcome message, Dr. Caranza gave a background of sericulture in NVSU, recalling its history in the early 1990s.

"Meron po kaming engagement with then NVSIT under the College of Forestry where it has established plantations before inside and outside the university. Ito 'yung binubuhay nating muli. May the signing of this MOA be the start of stronger collaboration that will link science

education and rural development. And together, let's ensure that silk in Nueva Vizcaya becomes the symbol of sustainable growth and creativity for the region and for the nation," he expressed.

Dr. Leaño, in his message, acknowledged NVSU's long-standing involvement in the field, noting that the university, formerly NVSIT, had hosted numerous garments technology students in the past. He explained that PTRI has now categorically identified the regions for expansion, with Nueva Vizcaya positioned as a lead point not only for Region II but also for Central Luzon.

He extended his gratitude to NVSU for sharing in the advocacy for textile innovation and sustainable growth.

For his part, Dr. Dumale highlighted the strategic importance of the partnership, stressing the need to understand the current state of the silk industry in the province. He emphasized the importance of working with the provincial government and conducting consultations with farmers to strengthen sericulture initiatives.

"We see nothing but a bright future in this partnership," Dr. Dumale said, expressing NVSU's strong commitment to the collaboration.

Through this agreement, both parties will jointly undertake research and development projects, facilitate knowledge exchange, and explore opportunities to integrate science, technology, and innovation in textile applications and allied industries.



NVSU inks MOA with DOH TRC RO2 for drug awareness education program

The Nueva Vizcaya State University (NVSU) became the first university in Region 2 to officially partner with the Department of Health Treatment and Rehabilitation Center (DOH TRC) Region 2 for a Drug Awareness Program through education, following a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) signing held at the Board Room, New Administration Building, NVSU Bayombong Campus, July 4.

The collaboration seeks to intensify drug prevention efforts among college students across NVSU's Bayombong and Bambang campuses, anchoring on education, early detection, counseling, and awareness-building.

During the opening remarks, Campus Administrator for NVSU Bayombong Dr. Arvin P. Vallesteros emphasized the importance of proactive approaches.

"In the past years ay wala naman, pero 'wag tayong maging complacent. We really welcome this kind of initiative, he said.

Meanwhile. Dr. Charity I. Canapi, Chief of Hospital III of DOH TRC Region 2, expressed her gratitude and optimism about the partnership.

"We are very honored at pinagbigyan ang aming proposal. Hindi na natin kailangang antayin na maging problema pa ito. Prevention is key, and that's why we are here to collaborate for this very important milestone," Dr. Canapi expressed.

She also noted that the rising number of youth involved in drug use has overwhelmed existing facilities.

"With early detection and early counseling, we believe we can prevent bigger problems. Sa dami ng kaso, halos hindi na namin ma-accommodate lahat. With the help of NVSU, mas mapapagaan at mas marami po tayong matutulungan," she added.

University President Dr. Wilfredo A. Dumale Jr. commended the initiative and affirmed NVSU's full support for the program.

Dr. Dumale also expressed intent to extend similar programs to the Department of Education in Nueva Vizcaya, particularly at the senior high school level.

He cited a recent NVSU collaboration with the Nueva Vizcaya General Comprehensive High School (NVGCHS) under Project AYWAN (Alliance for Youth & Workforce Well-being through Assessment and Nurturing), which focuses on early mental health assessments to support students' academic and emotional well-being.

He emphasized the need for unity and synergy in addressing challenges and guiding the university's strategic directions.



Legarda honors indigenous communities, pushes cultural empówerment at Ummong Festival

Senator Loren Legarda reaffirmed her commitment to Indigenous Cultural empowerment and inclusive

development during the Ummong Festival held at the Nueva Vizcaya State University (NVSU) on October 3, 2025.

Addressing local leaders, educators, students, and Indigenous cultural bearers, Legarda emphasized the vital role of Indigenous Peoples in shaping national identity and safeguarding the country's cultural wealth.

"Sa ating pagdiriwang ng Ummong, pinapanday natin ang isang yugto ng pagkakaisa, dangal, at panibagong pag-asa para sa ating mga pamayanan," Legarda said in her opening remarks, paying tribute to the province's enduring contributions for its Indigenous communities.

The Ummong Festival, now on its fourth year since its launch in 2022, is a cultural gathering organized by NVSU. Rooted in the word "ummong," meaning fellowship and reverence for one's origins, the event brings together IP communities from across the province to showcase traditional songs, dances, crafts, and customs, promoting the preservation of indigenous knowledge.

Legarda, Chairperson of the Senate Committee on Culture and the Arts, and a staunch advocate of cultural preservation, highlighted key initiatives she has championed in support of Indigenous Rights.

"Buong puso kong ipinaglaban at patuloy na isinusulong ang mga batas at programang nagpapalakas sa karapatan, kultura, at kabuhayan ng mga katutubong Pilipino," she said, citing the Cultural Mapping Law, National Indigenous Peoples Day, and the establishment of Schools of Living Traditions such as the Kalahan Academy in Sta. Fe.

The four-term senator also underscored the importance of language preservation through the Bantayog ng Wika program, noting the installation of a monument in Bayombong honoring the Gaddang language.

"Itinataguyod din natin ang Bantayog ng Wika upang mapanatili at bigyang-dangal ang ating mga katutubong wika at tradisyon," Legarda said. Legarda called for continued support for Indigenous Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs), recognizing their role in strengthening local economies.

"Patuloy ang ating suporta upang mapalakas ang kabuhayan at sariling pagkakitaan ng mga pamayanan," she affirmed. Reflecting on the spirit of the festival, Legarda described Ummong as "isang pagdiriwang ng samahan at paggalang sa ating mga pinagmulan, pamumuhay, at karunungan."

Legarda into its academic family as it confers upon her the degree of Doctor of Education, Major in Educational Management, Honord Cabia, 160 October 3, 2025, in recognition of her exemplary leadership, lifelong commitment to education reform, and transformative contributions to nation-building.

Senator Legarda is a four-term legislator who has authored and sponsored landmark laws advancing inclusive, sustainable, and resilient national development. She remains the only woman and resilient national development. She remains the only woman to have topped two senatorial elections, in 1998 and 2007. A trailblazer in the Senate, she was its first female Majority Leader and later served as Senate President Pro Tempore during the 1st and 2nd Regular Sessions of the 19th Congress.

From 2019 to 2022, she represented the Lone District of Antique in the House of Representatives, serving as Deputy Speaker—the first and only Antiqueña to hold the post.

On the global stage, Senator Legarda has earned distinction for her unwavering advocacy for climate action and sustainable governance. She has been recognized as a Global

sustainable governance. She has been recognized as a Global Leader for Tomorrow by the World Economic Forum, a UN Environment Programme Global 500 Laureate, ASEAN Biodiversity Hero, UNDRR Global Champion for Resilience,





Commissioner of the Global Commission on Adaptation, Climate Vulnerable Forum Ambassador for Parliaments, and Women Political Leaders Global Ambassador for Climate and Environment.

A cum laude graduate of the University of the Philippines, Senator Legarda holds a Doctor of Laws, Honoris Causa from the same institution. She also topped her class at the National Defense College of the Philippines, completed the AFP Command and General Staff Course, and currently serves as a full colonel in the Philippine Air Force Reserve.

At present, Senator Legarda chairs the Senate Committee on Higher, Technical, and Vocational Education, the Committee on Culture and the Arts, and was the first woman to chair the Committee on National Defense and Security, Peace, Unification, and Reconciliation. She is also the Co-Chairperson of the Second Congressional Commission on Education (EDCOM 2), steering major reforms to address the country's learning crisis.

As an author and co-sponsor of landmark legislation such as the Enhanced Basic Education Act (RA 10533), Universal Access to Quality Tertiary Education Act (RA 10931), and the National Environmental Awareness and Education Act (RA 9512), Legarda has consistently advanced her vision of accessible, quality, and transformative education for all Filipinos.

Her recent educational measures—including the Basic Education Mental Health and Well-Being Promotion Act (RA 12080), Early Childhood Care and Development System Act (RA 12199), and the ARAL Program Act (RA 12028)—respond to the pressing needs of learners and educators nationwide. She also supports lifelong learning through the Expanded Tertiary Education Equivalency and Accreditation Program (RA 12124) and bridges the gap between education and employment through the Enterprise-Based Education and Training Framework Act (RA 12063).

In honor of teachers, Legarda co-authored and co-sponsored the Kabalikat sa Pagtuturo Act (RA 11997), which raises the teaching allowance to P10,000 beginning 2025, and the Career Progression System for Public School Teachers and School Leaders Act (RA 12288), which opens new pathways for professional growth.

Her commitment to education also extends to funding reforms. As Chairperson of the Senate Committee on Finance in 2017, she allocated P8 billion to begin funding free college education—an initiative that paved the way for the implementation of the Universal Access to Quality Tertiary Education Act. Today, she continues to champion accountability and sufficiency in education budgets for state universities and colleges.

For NVSU, the conferment of this honorary doctorate is not only a tribute to Senator Legarda's enduring service but also an affirmation of shared values—education, empowerment, and excellence. Approved last year by the Board of Regents and CHED en banc when she was Chair of the Senate Committee on Culture and Arts, this recognition honors her tireless championship for Indigenous Peoples—especially meaningful for NVSU as a true melting pot of diversity, with Nueva Vizcaya home to 18 IP groups.

With her visionary leadership and steadfast advocacy for the Filipino learner, Dr. Loren Legarda now stands as an honorary alumna of Nueva Vizcaya State University—a symbol of wisdom, resilience, and national pride. Indeed, NVSU welcomes Dr. Loren Legarda as one
