NVSU explores collaborative opportunities in Japan

The Nueva Vizcaya State University (NVSU) delegation, led by President Dr. Wilfredo A. Dumale, Jr, engaged in a series of strategic meetings in Japan aimed at enhancing agricultural practices, information technology collaboration, and educational opportunities from Aug. 19 to 21, 2024.

Urban Agriculture Insights

On August 21, NVSU visited Neighbor's Farm in Tokyo, a pioneering urban farm run by Katsura Umemura, a graduate of the University of Tokyo. The farm exemplifies innovative agricultural techniques, including automated systems and eco-friendly pest control, to produce high-quality vegetables in an urban setting. Umemura emphasized the importance of urban agriculture in enhancing food security and sustainability, addressing challenges such as space constraints and the need for technological advancements. The visit showcased NVSU's commitment to integrating global best practices into its academic and research initiatives.

ICT Collaboration with Toyo Systems

On August 20, NVSU met with Toyo Systems Development Cooperative to explore potential collaborations in information and communication technology (ICT). Discussions included technical internship programs for NVSU students in Japan's advanced IT industry, aiming to provide valuable hands-on experience and career opportunities for young Filipino professionals.

Citrus Farming Partnership with JA Group



On August 20, 2024, NVSU held discussions with Gotemba City Mayor Katsumata Masami in Shizuoka, Japan, regarding NVSU's citrus research program. The meeting, facilitated by OISCA International, included key officials from both NVSU and Gotemba City, as well as representatives from OISCA. They exchanged tokens, with Dr. Dumale presenting a traditional Filipino handwoven table runner. The meeting highlighted Shizuoka's expertise in citrus farming and historical ties to Nueva Vizcaya.

Engagement with Filipino Students in Japan

The meeting highlighted plans to organize a joint research colloquium and promote scholarship opportunities, promoting connections between NVSU graduates and Japanese educational programs.

To gain first-hand experience with advanced sericulture technologies and expand professional network, Dr. Regino L. Galate, NVSU International Affairs Coordinator for the College of Teacher Education, participated in the Sericulture and Silk Industry Training in Japan, held from Sept. 1 to 7, 2024.

Sponsored by the Organization of International, Spiritual and Cultural Advancement (OISCA), the training aimed to deepen participants' understanding of best practices in sericulture farming, enhance technical expertise in silk processing, and promote cooperative networks with Japan's globally renowned silk industry.

The training exposed participants to the advanced technical facilities that drive the silk industry in Japan, positioning them to apply innovative techniques in sericulture development

in their respective countries.

Key areas of focus during the training included best practices in sericulture farming, advanced technical facilities in Silk Processing and Production and Japan's high-tech silk processing infrastructure, and the promotion of cooperative networks with Japan's silk industry.

Throughout the week-long event, Dr. Galate, and other participants visited several key locations that served as the heart of Japan's silk industry such as the Sericulture Science and Technology Research Institute in Ibaraki; Tomioka Silk Mill in Gunma; Okaya Silk Mill Museum in Nagano, Komagane Silk Museum in Nagano; Daio Wasabi Farm in Nagano, Japan, and Ashizawa Silkworm Farm in Yamanashi.

In addition to site visits, participants were given the opportunity to meet key figures in Japan's silk industry through a courtesy call to OISCA's Tokyo Headquarters, where they held a meeting with OISCA President Ms. Etsuko Nakano and Secretary General Yasuaki Nagaishi. | JMP

Pres. Dumale inspires graduates
from Japan to return, serve the Nation

Nueva Vizcaya State University (NVSU) President Dr. Wilfredo A. Dumale Jr. delivered an inspiring message during the "Paghayo sa Taglagas 2024" event, a collaboration between the Association of Filipino Students in Japan (AFSJ) and the Philippine Embassy that aims to honor the achievements of Filipino graduates studying in Japan, that was held at the Embassy of the Republic of the Philippines in Tokyo, Japan and via Zoom, Sept. 24, 2024.

Speaking to an audience of public servants and scholars, President Dumale emphasized the significant role of education for Filipinos and its ability to help uplift the country.

"Alam nating lahat na ang paglilingkod sa bayan ay isang pagtitiwala na ibinigay ng ating mamamayan," Pres. Dumale began, highlighting the trust that public service demands.

Reflecting on his own experience as an alumnus of the Japanese Government Scholarship, he shared how his journey led him back to the Philippines to enhance public service.

"Ngayon, narito ako sa Pilipinas at patuloy na nagsisikap upang mapataas ang antas ng paglilingkod sa bayan," he stated.

Pres. Dumale acknowledged the challenges faced by the country, including political, social, and environmental issues but encouraged graduates to remain hopeful and to contribute to nation-building.

"Ako mismo bilang isang lingkod-bayan ang nagsasabi na napakaraming magagandang bagay ang nangyayari sa ating bansa. Mas marami tayong natutulungan ngayon," he said.

He called on the graduates to consider returning to the Philippines and applying their skills to help elevate the nation.

"Kayo ay aming inaamuki, na sana magkaroon kayo ng pagkakataong makabalik sa ating bayang sinilangan at iambag ang inyong kakayahan," he appealed, pointing out the need for more hands and minds to come together for the country's progress.

Pres. Dumale also recognized the sacrifices made by the families of the graduates, acknowledging the emotional and financial struggles they endured while their loved ones pursued education abroad.

As he concluded, Pres. Dumale reinforced the importance of using one's skills for the country, wherever life may lead.

"Humayo kayo at gamitin ang galing na nakuha ninyo. Subalit sa bawat hakbang na inyong gagawin, maalala ninyo ang ating pinakamahal na inang bayan," he expressed. | JMP

Tiken showcases talent in int'l stage; wins medals in '24 WCOPA



Additionally, the Bachelor of Science in Fisheries and Bachelor of Science in Ecotourism programs were assessed for the 1st Survey Revisit.



Gaffud- Marquez, Regional Director, visited Nueva Vizcaya State University (NVSU) to discuss a potential partnership for offering Training of Trainers (TOTs) programs for Cooperative Training Providers (CTPROs).

The meeting brought together NVSU President Dr. Wilfredo A. Dumale Jr. and other key personnel to explore how the university can support the CDA's initiatives.

The proposed collaboration is in line with Article 44 and Section 5, Rule 7 of the Implementing Rules and Regulations of Republic Act No. 9520 (Philippine Cooperative Code of 2008), which mandates that cooperative officers

undergo necessary training conducted by accredited trainers.

The CDA representatives emphasized the importance of strengthening cooperative education by ensuring that trainers from accredited CTPROs complete at least 24 hours of TOT, as stipulated in CDA Memorandum Circular No. 2023-11.

Dr. Dumale expressed enthusiasm about the possibility of NVSU offering these specialized training programs, emphasizing the university's commitment to community development and empowerment.

The partnership is set to be formalized with the signing of a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA), scheduled for October 2024.
