Nueva Vizcaya State University (NVSU) and Mie University, Japan, formalized a partnership to enhance academic and research opportunities through the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), at the Board Room of the New Administration Building, NVSU, December 13, 2024

The MOU, which focuses on student exchange and joint research initiatives, was signed in the presence of key officials from both universities.

Prof. Dr. Morio Tsukuda, Head of the International Exchange Committee of the Graduate School of Bioresources, Mie University, delivered a message highlighting the alignment between the two institutions.

"Our universities have many similar things. We are both located [in regions famous with citrus production center - NVSU and Mie. We expect [that] we can have good joint research and, we now want next scholarship of priorities so we can accept several PhD students so that means not only the student research but also student exchange is very expected. To solidify partnerships in agricultural research and innovation, Nueva Vizcaya State University (NVSU) and Mie University, Japan, conducted workshops and an international seminar at the Crop Science Laboratory, College of Agriculture and at the Function Room, New Administration Building, respectively, on December 12 and 13, 2024.

The workshop on "Isolation and Preliminary Identification of Phytopathogenic Fungi" provided handson training to students and faculty members of NVSU.

Facilitated by Prof. Dr. Chiharu
Nakashima from Mie University, the
activity focused on identifying fungal
pathogens affecting citrus and banana
crops, addressing critical challenges in the
region's agricultural sector. Participants
learned cutting-edge techniques for
diagnosing and managing plant diseases,
an essential step in promoting resilient
citrus production systems.

Meanwhile, the conduct of the 10th International Seminar Series: "Global Collaborations in Citrus Research: Innovations for Sustainable Agriculture" aimed to advance collaborative research on citrus cultivation and agricultural innovation while promoting cultural and academic exchanges between NVSU and Mie University.

Participants included NVSU officials, faculty, and selected students from the Colleges of Agriculture and Engineering and higher education institutions in the country who joined via Zoom meeting and Facebook live.

Community Engagement: The Podium promotes community engagement by featuring stories of alumni success, student accomplishments, faculty research, and staff contributions.



My students' bags are definitely screaming "Indigenous" all over the classroom today!

While distributing my exam sheets, I couldn't help noticing the bags paraded on the floor-they're all traditionally woven bags! Unable to contain my amazement, I rushed to the front and blurted out, "Omg! Ang gaganda ng bags ninyo!" considering the fact that I don't usually encounter Gen-Z students using these kinds of bags nowadays (tell me about buying branded!) and that I also couldn't buy one myself due to their atrocious price in the market. Of course, these are traditionally woven bags.

My students felt the thrill in my voice and saw the smile painted all over my face, so they began to share stories about their bags and how they got them. One student said she borrowed her bag from her aunt, and another from a friend. Some of the boys mentioned their bags were mementos from their parents and grandparents. Some also said they didn't mind buying them for a minimal cost (₱75-₱200) from a local store in their community.

The satisfying thing about it is that the way they wear their bags is still cool and fashionable. Some girls tied a handkerchief around them to make them look more colorful and slick. Some students also attached locally made keychains and adornments, one of which was labeled "BAG-O." The rest preferred their plain bags as they were.

These woven bags struggle to maintain their cultural value against the changing trends and preferences of



contemporary society. But they never actually fade in functionality and style. They are minimalistic, spacious, durable (except when frequently exposed to water), and often recyclable. These bags do not only represent local fashion but, more importantly, convey a social aspect of diminishing weaving traditions, cultural values, and indigenous wisdom.

My cheering heart goes out to Sir Felix Podda, who came up with this amazing and meaningful idea for his GE INDI classes. Not only will his students remember their roots, but they will also inadvertently raise awareness about indigenous knowledge and practices. I didn't want to miss the chance to take photos of the proud and gleeful young people in their best attire for the entire IP month of October. Lastly, this piques my curiosity regarding that million-peso campus question, "What's one unique thing about your university?"

NVSU conducts Earthquake Drill, earns 'Very Satisfactory' rating

In support of the 2024 4th Quarter Nationwide Simultaneous Earthquake Drill (NSED) and in compliance with the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC) Memorandum No. 013, series of 2024, the Nueva Vizcaya State University (NVSU) Bayombong Campus conducted an earthquake drill that earned a "Very Satisfactory" rating from evaluators, Dec. 04, 2024.

Organized by the NVSU Disaster Risk Reduction and Management (DRRM) team in collaboration with the University Emergency Response Team (UERT), NVSU Red Cross Youth (RCY) and local emergency response units, following strict guidelines and protocols outlined by the NDRRMC, the drill highlighted the university's proactive stance in ensuring the safety and preparedness of its students, faculty, staff and other stakeholders.

The evaluators, composed of representatives from Nueva Vizcaya Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office Nueva Vizcaya Emergency Response Team (PDRRMO NVERT), Provincial Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP) Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (MDRRMO), Independent Kabalikat Civicom Inc. (IKCI), and United Kabalikat Civicom 165M Nueva Vizcaya, commended NVSU for its comprehensive preparation, efficient execution, and high level of community engagement.

"Congratulations NVSU! Kung irerate ko itong earthquake drill na ito, isa ito sa pinaka-successful earthquake drills pagdating sa eskwelahan na nakita ko," one representative from PDRRMO NVERT said.

'PROWESS UNLEASHED'

NVSU Archer clinches 3rd place at the World Archery PH

NVSUan archer Mark Angelo Aradanas set another record, securing third place in the Olympic round finale of the Under-21 Recurve event at the prestigious World Archery Philippines (WAP), Leg 3 held in Zamboanga City yesterday, Oct. 5.

Competing against 10 participants, including two former Palarong Pambansa gold medalists and two Philippine team archers, Aradanas triumphed over Marikina's Sean Tanco 7-3 (28-26, 27-27, 27-21, 25-26, 28-23) to secure third place.

"My performance [in] this tournament is bad

because I don't have a lot of time to practice, my arms are shaking, I get tired immediately, and my back tension is not responding well," he shared.

Before the WAP Leg in Zamboanga, he also garnered medals during the WAP Leg in Cebu (Top 3) and WAP Sorsogon (Top 2).

King Archer Aradanas also shared the limelight with former Palarong Pambansa and PRISAA gold medalist Reinzbert Burgos, and Philippine Team archer Girvin Garcia, who clinched first and second places, respectively.

"I didn't expect to win the tournament since I didn't put much effort into training. However, I was happy to have given my best and won the bronze medal." he continued.

Nueva Vizcaya Archery Club Coach Alexis Raquipo described Aradanas as an obedient, talented athlete. "Actually, kaya niya yung rank 1 at tsaka rank 2 kaso siguro nagkulang sa training kasi [...] mahirap talagang i-balance yung academics at tsaka sport," Coach

Raquipo added.
According to him, Aradanas was consistently at rank 2 and 3 spot in the last 2 Legs of the Grassroots
Development Program Tournaments.

Aradanas was named "Athlete of the Year" after winning 8 golds and leading NVSU to the championship in archery during CaVRASUC 2022.
